PG: Great Place for Business

Downtown – Thirteen new businesses have taken up most of the vacant spaces in the City's core. Credit for the revival should go, in part, to the Downtown Advisory Board and its many committee chairs and staff people. Come see the new dress shop, photo studio, printer, sign maker, Yoga salon, quilt shop, dog spa, and other boutiques as well as several newly remodeled businesses. We still want occupants for Smith Grocery, Grove Theater, and some vacant lots.

The Grove – Fifteen new businesses have taken occupancy in eleven office buildings in The Grove area. And, they're the kinds of businesses we have hoped for. Included are technology companies, marketers, engineers, and educators. The new companies are currently providing 466 jobs. That means The Grove area is about 10% built out. We still have room for another 150 businesses and 4,300 employees.... and still no full service restaurants.... amazing!

Speaking of **Restaurants** – The City is offering a \$10k reward for a full service restaurant with projected annual sales of \$2M. The offer amounts to refunding the City sales tax for the restaurant's first year sales. See the details on www.plgrove.org, Economic Development, Restaurants.
