2018-2019 BUDGET



Pleasant Grove City recently adopted its budget for the 2018-2019 fiscal year. A copy of this budget is available for review on the City's website at <https://pgcity.org/pdf/2019%20adopted%20budget.pdf>. In September, the City will publish a detailed document that includes the City budget as well other financial information relative to the financial condition of the City. I encourage everyone to review this information in order to better understand the City's finances.

For the upcoming year, Pleasant Grove's General Fund budget is \$13,608,992. The General Fund is where City services not generally associated with user fees are accounted for. Services such as police, fire, parks, library, streets maintenance, and planning are all in the General Fund. The City also has other funds to account for other City services. Street surface treatments, recreation programs, and emergency dispatch are all accounted for in separate funds because they have a fee or tax specifically associated with them. Finally, the City has four utilities: water, sewer, storm drain, and solid waste. These activities are accounted for in enterprise funds due to the fact that user fees are intended to cover the full cost of these services.

I hope you choose to review our City budget. I know the budget can be complicated and maybe even confusing at first glance. Part of my job as the City Finance Director is to explain the budget to Pleasant Grove residents. Please call or come by to meet with me if you have any questions. I would be happy to discuss the budget or any questions you may have related to the City's finances.
