### Pleasant Grove Public Safety Building Fundraiser

#### Be a Part of History

As construction commences on the new Public Safety Buildings, Pleasant Grove City is having a fundraiser to give you an opportunity to be a recognized financial supporter of the new facilities. At the onset of the project, a fundraising goal of \$2.5M was set to help ensure that the building had the needed size and durability. As of now, we have received just under \$2M in donations. We need help to raise the remaining \$500K.



Although construction has started, each dollar that is raised through donations, will be a dollar less of taxpayer funds needed to complete the project. The City has been setting funds aside if the additional \$500K can't be raised, but using that money could be at the expense of other needed projects in the City.

The Honorary Colonels is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization that supports Pleasant Grove Public Safety. They will handle the collecting of donated funds towards the project. Each donation through the Honorary Colonels will be tax deductible.

We will accept and be grateful for any amount that you are willing to donate. For those that donate between \$100-\$5,000, they will be recognized by name in the new building. Donations over \$5,000 will receive a special recognition in the new building.
