### ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT IN PLEASANT GROVE

As you have noticed, lots of things are happening in the development of Pleasant Grove. There are too many new businesses to highlight here, but we'll mention some of the restaurant, hospitality and entertainment options. Here's a list of some of the new businesses that have recently opened or will be opening soon:

**Jersey Mikes Sub Shop and Starbucks-** These businesses have recently opened and are located on the west end of Pleasant Grove Blvd. near the I-15 interchange. You'll see their buildings on the north side of the road.

**R&R Barbecue-** R&R opened at the beginning of August and they are located on the west end of Pleasant Grove Blvd. as well. They are on the south side of the road.

**Mo' Bettahs and Beans & Brews-** These two businesses are located in front of the Macey's grocery store where the old Sonic Drive-In was located. Mo' Bettahs serves Hawaiian food and Beans & Brews is a coffee shop. Both businesses will be open by the end of the year.
